In 2021, care experienced young people decided what their main priorities should be:

- Lessening the Shock of the Move to Independence
- More Support for Care Leavers
- Brothers and Sisters Growing-up Together
- Social Worker Stability
- Better and Less Rules
- Reducing Childhood Poverty

Over the last two years our groups of young people have been meeting with foster carers, social workers, councillors and managers to talk about their priorities.



Our groups are safe places, where care experienced young people have felt able to talk about their experiences and feelings.

Because our young people are the experts, they have been able to work with adults to identify the problems and come up with some amazing solutions.



Then it's over to the adults to make meaningful changes to the way services are provided, and make things better for care experienced young people.



How we do it





Young people training adults:

We help adults understand what children feel, need, and want. We design and deliver three different training courses:

- Challenging Stereotypes for Children in Care
- Preparation to FosteringParticipation and Voices Training

Young People Interview Panels:

We check-out if the people applying for jobs working with children have the right skills and attitude.

Members of the 16+ Forum got together for a game of tennis.



We delivered Challenging Stereotypes Training to PCSOs, Health Visitors and Residential Workers.


This important training gets adults to see children in care as individuals and not as a label.

Do You Know Your Top 10 Rights in Care?

1. You have the right to be looked after well and have all the usual support and help a child or young person living at home would usually get.

2. You have the right to get involved in every decision that affects your life in care.

3. You have the right to information and to see what is written about you. This information should be given to you in an open and honest way and in a way you can understand.

4. You have the right to have contact with your family (including brothers and sisters) unless it is dangerous for you to do so.

5. You have the right to follow your own religion and be supported to do so.

6. You have the right to make private phone calls to your social worker and advocate.

7. You have the right to have your race, culture and language respected and supported.

8. You have the right to meet with your social worker without your carers and keyworker being there.

9. You have the right to be safe and protected from those who may harm you.

10. You have the right to make a complaint if you are not happy about the service you are getting from Wakefield Council, and you also have the right to have help and information from an independent advocate if you want to make a complaint.

AUG'23



10 care experienced adults from Wakefield took part in a fun footy competition against peers from Bradford, Kirklees, Leeds, and Calderdale.



Members of CICC, and the 16+ Forum, took over the Children and Young People's Partnership Board.

They told them that many young people don't feel prepared for adulthood.

They suggested developing an App, which provides activities that would help young people to develop the skills and confidence they need.

> Three times a year, we meet with Councillors and Council Managers at the Corporate Parenting Committee. This month we shared our ideas about how to make sure children can grow up with their siblings. We worked together to make an action plan and they promised to tell us what improvements they are making.

Just a reminder that the refer a friend scheme is still ongoing!

Do you know someone who has the skills and qualities to be a foster carer?

There's a fantastic £1,000 referral payment to any Wakefield carer who refers someone who then goes on to become a foster carer and has a child or young person in placement for three months. To qualify for the payment, you'll need to ask the person you refer to tell the Foster Service your name at the point of enquiry. Contact Fostering@wakefield.gov.uk

By providing supported lodgings you can help young people in the transition from being in care to being an independent adult. Supported lodgings providers can work full time hours (both can if you're a couple.)
