In early 2024, Care Experienced Young People decided what their main priorities should be.

- Better info for care experienced young people
- More emotional support for Foster Carers, Social Workers and Care Experienced People
- Reducing loneliness for Care Leavers
- More support for all Care Experienced people

Over the next two years our groups of young people will meet with Foster Carers, Social Workers, Councillors and Managers to talk about these priorities.



Our groups are safe places where care experienced young people can choose to talk about their experiences and feelings.

Because our young people are the experts, they will work with adults to identify the problems and come up with some amazing solutions.





Then it's over to the adults to make meaningful changes to the way services are provided, and let us all know how they have made things better for care experienced young people.



How we do it



Young people training adults:

We help adults understand what children feel, need, and want. We design and deliver training courses:

- Challenging Stereotypes for Children in Care
- Preparation to Fostering
- Participation and Voices Training
- Teacher Training

Young People Interview Panels:

We check-out if the people applying for jobs working with children have the right skills and attitude.

Refer a Friend Scheme

Just a reminder that the refer a friend scheme is still ongoing!

Do you know someone who has the skills and qualities to be a foster carer?

There's a fantastic £1,000 referral payment to any Wakefield carer who refers someone who then goes on to become a foster carer and has a child or young person in placement for three months. To qualify for the payment, you'll need to ask the person you refer to tell the Foster Service your name at the point of enquiry. Contact Fostering@wakefield.gov.uk






"I think others should join because you make good friends and you don't feel left-out or lonely. Last year's activities were fun because we got to go in the forest making different things, learning survival skills."
